

## Little Jannah Daycare Nursery

### Price list: Full Paying & Government Funded Children (Prices below will commence from: 1<sup>st</sup> March 2026)

(Please note that these prices are usually reviewed & increased annually in line with inflation on the 1<sup>st</sup> of March each year)

### PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION BELOW APPLIES TO FULL PAYING and GOVERNMENT FUNDED CHILDREN from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025:

A) Working parents of children aged 9months to 4 years get 30 hours of funding for their child (from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025, parents need to apply for this help on the Government website to check your eligibility). Parents will need to pay an additional daily resources fee for consumables not covered by the Government childcare subsidies as follows:

**Baby Room £36.50      Toddler/Inventors Room £28.00      Pre-School Room £26.50**

B) For children aged 3–4 years who are not eligible for the full 30 hours of funding, they will still get a 15 hours funded place (Parents will need to pay an additional half day nursery fee plus the resources fee for consumables each week).

**Pre-School Room £26.50 on the 1<sup>st</sup> day & £75.00 (nursery fee £48.50 + resources fee £26.50) on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day**

C) Please note that the Government funded 15/30 hours funding is only available term time only in all rooms. During the School holiday term dates the price chargeable is the usual nursery fees for a full or half day according to your child's age (see table above).

D) Additional attendance days - the usual full or half day nursery fee according to your child's age will apply for any additional day/s you require for your child to attend the setting outside of the Government funding hours (unfortunately, we are not able to swap your child's day if s/he is not able to attend on the agreed set days, this is due to staff-children ratios).

E) Please note that the Government funded 15/30 hours is given according to the child's birthday and follows the school term, 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1<sup>st</sup> April and 1<sup>st</sup> September. If your child is born after these cut-off dates then they will be eligible for the funding from the next term date eg: a child born on 2<sup>nd</sup> April would be eligible from 1<sup>st</sup> September.

**Prices for Ad Hoc extra days required are:** The full day Nursery fee plus £9.00 according to the child's age and whether a full day or half day session is needed.

Under 2's                    - £99.00

2-3 years                    - £94.00

3-5 years                    - £88.00 (3-5 years half day session - £74.00)

**Nursery fee price reduction:** This will take place when your child/ren turns 2 or 3 years and you will see the reduction on your invoice in the month after your child/ren's 2nd or 3rd birthday. This will be done automatically by management when the invoices are sent out, but if you notice that your fee is not reduced the month after your child's 2nd or 3rd birthday then please email to inform management.

**The fee for the monthly Forest School session is:** £17 per child for each session – if your child is not already joining these monthly sessions then please let management know if you want your child to start attending (**please note that your child will need to be a strong walker in order to attend and that fees are still payable even if your child is unable to attend**). Sessions run from September to July each year.

**Registration fee is:** £100 per child (non-refundable)

**Settling in fee for a new child:** This will be charged as a 3 or 6 hours session according to the age of the child. The fee is £107.00 for all age groups.

**Deposit to secure a new child's place:** A £250 deposit per child to secure a place is payable approximately 3 months before your child starts Nursery, this fee is (refundable) providing that 1-month's written notice of your child leaving the Nursery is given.

**This 1<sup>st</sup> table below demonstrates the 9months+-to 4-year-old 15 universal hours per week = 570 hours per year (Plus) the additional extra 15 hours per week = 570 hours per year of funding. The 30 hours can be spread over the week and represents 3 full days of attendance.**

**This 2<sup>nd</sup> table below demonstrates the entitlement for 3 to 4 year olds who are only entitled to (15 hours per week = 570 hours per year).**

**Hours can be spread over the week and the 15 hours funding equates to 1 and a half days.**

### **MINIMUM REQUIRED ATTENDANCE**

Please note that our minimum requirement for a child to attend Little Jannah Nursery is as follows:  
**2 days minimum attendance in the Baby and Toddler rooms.**

Minimum attendance in the Pre-School room is according to whether parents are entitled to the 15 or 30 hours of Government funding
